PICK UP LOCATION AND DEPARTURE

Customers are advised to be at their departure location 10 minutes prior to departure. As we have several locations to pick up from your coach will depart your location as the stated times. If you are not at the departure location, we will endeavor to contact you by phone to find out where you are. Please ensure that you have supplied your mobile phone number.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

We follow the government guidelines to ensure the health of our valued customers. To ensure the safety of our customers we ask that if you are unwell, please stay home. Passengers that develop signs of illness whilst on an extended tour will be required to wear a mask.

PAYMENT

No payment is required when initially book your tour and you can book your tours and reserve your seats for the whole year.
